

ANZCA Video Examinations Recording Information

ANZCA's new Video Exam formats fall into two distinct categories:

- **ANZCA Go!** exam videos must be recorded and uploaded one piece at a time. You can upload more than one video with your enrolment if you wish, but they must be separate files. When your first upload is complete, you will be provided with a link to upload the remainder of the pieces when they are ready. You have 12 months to upload 4 pieces from the time of entry.
- **Video Performance** exam videos: the required four pieces must be recorded in one take, with no pauses or edits. There's no need to enrol until you have a video ready to upload.

Make sure you have a pre-recorded exam video ready before enrolling for ANZCA's Video Performance and ANZCA Go! exams.

Use a 720p camera resolution where possible, as file sizes over 2GB will fail to upload. If your recording device can't record at a lower resolution, file compression can be used. Avoid recording in 4K.

Camera Angles

The camera must be placed on a stable surface, not hand held.

The required set up/angle for different instruments is shown below:

1. **PIANO STUDENTS:** Note that the pedal / feet and keyboard are clearly visible.
2. **SINGING STUDENTS:** Select the angle from the front and from the hips up.
Also use this position for: VIOLIN, WIND & BRASS STUDENTS
3. **GUITAR STUDENTS:** This is the required angle.
4. **DRUM STUDENTS:** This is the best position.
